

# POTY 2019-2020

Cork Camera Group held its postponed Photographer of the Year (POTY) Competition on November 3<sup>rd</sup>. Like all camera clubs across the country, we were forced to move our activities online last March because of the current Covid 19 situation. We were able to complete almost all of our scheduled meetings and competitions, with the exception of the POTY.

POTY in Cork Camera Group has traditionally been a Print competition. Members are asked to submit 6 Prints. These prints are judged, with the best 5 scores counting towards your final position.
